NOTABLE ACCOMPLISHMENTS...

Dr. Robert Teasell:



- Dr. Teasell delivered the keynote Hnatyshyn Lecture at the 7th Annual Stroke Congress in Quebec City on September 15th and spoke on the topic of "Stroke Rehabilitation at a Crossroads". The Stroke Congress included an assembly of over 800 stroke clinicians and academics from across the country. This is the first time a physiatrist has been asked to give the Hnatyshyn Lecture which is named in honour of one of Canada's Governor Generals. The conference was also attended by the Quebec's Minister of Health; Dr. Teasell also had the opportunity to discuss building outpatient stroke rehabilitation capacity in the province of Quebec.
