The successful candidate will work under the direction of Dr. Cheryl Forchuk, Beryl & Richard Ivey Research Chair in the role of "PIR, Research Facilitator". This position will assist the Chair and PIR senior leadership in advancing inter-disciplinary and translational research within Parkwood Institute Research.

The incumbent will provide day-to-day support to a number of strategic initiatives. This includes assisting with the planning of internal research support for PIR researchers, developing and promoting close collaboration across PIR research groups, assisting with mentorship of early career researchers, supporting design of strategic plans/knowledge transition plans, and the planning, preparation and submission of grants across a broad spectrum of research areas. Additionally, the incumbent will work closely with Lawson's Grants Development team and St. Joseph's Health Care Foundation, as required.

This position is a 5 day per week (37.5 hours per week) permanent position.

## **Essential Qualifications**

- Provide vaccination records or proof of immunity against measles, mumps rubella and varicella (chicken pox)
- Provide documentation of the Tuberculosis skin testing
- Graduate Degree in health-related field is preferred however equivalent qualification/ work experience will be considered

- Proven ability to develop relationships in a professional and respectful manner
